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## 7. INSTITUTIONAL STATEMENT

This one-page statement must be prepared and signed by an institutional representative and be on the institution's letterhead. It should be addressed, "To 2019 Awards Jury." Names of any and all consultants should be concealed. Refer to them as "the consultant, the team, the project manager, the landscape architect, the engineer, etc." The consultant should review this letter and mark out any references that are inadvertently included before scanning and including it in their submittal. The statement should describe or explain the following:

- » Describe the project in relation to the academic and/or student life requirements and the overall physical campus plan.
- » How does the landscape design and plan meet the institutional vision and mission?
- » How does it respond to or plan for campus heritage?
- » Why should it receive award recognition?
- » Include any additional or noteworthy information.
- » Explain any unique event or relationship with the project team that occurred during the project, if applicable.
